Felixstowe Peninsula Community Partnership

Brief outline of meeting held Wednesday 1st July at Sports and Social Club

Community Partnership Manager Andy Jolliffe, ESC, gave brief update which included a focus on match funding work and looking at Social value on funding spent.

Social value could be more complex to determine, which was something the team to do more of going forward.

Sam Read, Communities Officer confirmed Partnership four priorities for this year.

These are....

- * Give every young person the pathway to thrive - with focus on assessing education and training
- * Support healthy lifestyles with focus on shared skills development in socially and economically deprived areas.
- * Support Community health care (pre diagnosis) with focus on prevention measures and early detection
- * Alleviate social isolation and loneliness with a link to health conditions and intergenerational model.

On the final priority it was put forward by Cllr Tristan Gale that all very well for those with technology access/savy to go on council website to get information on availability of various organisations but a hard copy leaflet would reach all. I fully supported this suggestion.

It was suggested information might be delivered by volunteers in each parish, however after meeting I thought such a leaflet could be delivered along with ESC newsletter and I will contact Partnership chairman accordingly.

I spoke about PC producing a hardcopy parish information pack for new residents of various new builds with pack also available on line
